

This wonderful books shows us how much we've lost by thinking that our Western ways were the only good ways. We thought that we had God on our side, but the extermination of a culture that had so much to teach us, should give us pause. It's not too late to adhere to most of the Native American values, in fact the Amish still do and I'm guessing that they don't have the drug

abuse-teen pregnancy-suicide rates that our culture has to deal with. I made so many notes in this book that it's hard to share what I found most important. Isn't it amazing that most of the captive whites stayed with the Natives when they had the chance to leave, and while some did leave, they too came back. Native children who'd only known the white man's culture, went back to the Native way of life when given the chance. It seems like anyone who had a choice, went with the Natives. I don't find this too hard to believe because in our own culture, when given a chance, we too choose to camp, hunt, and fish in small groups of friends. No one seems to want to do their job on their day off, unless they love their job and that job seems to be part of a group working for the greater good (firemen, musicians, doctors, police). Written as a fictional story of a young man talking to a 118 year old elder, Kurt Kaltreider weaves the Native way of life into true life accounts to form a beautiful vision of a 'paradise lost' in our country which dates back only a couple hundred years. . . .
